RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION
2017.019 AND THE VILLAGE OF
BLANCHESTER PUBLIC COMMENT
POLICY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Village of Blanchester passed Resolution 2017-019 to adopt a Public Comment Policy for the Village of Blanchester's council meetings;

WHEREAS, the Village of Blanchester desires to revise the public comment policy pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 731.19.

WHEREAS, Resolution 2017-019 is attached to this Resolution as Exhibit A.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the Village of Blanchester, Ohio, to revise the Public Comment Policy so that it may read:

Section 1.

VILLAGE OF BLANCHESTER PUBLIC COMMENT POLICY

The Blanchester Village Council welcomes public comments at their meetings and sets aside time in the agenda for public comment. All meetings of the Council are open to the public, subject to Executive Session Privilege. In order to permit the fair and orderly expression of such Public Comment, the Council shall provide a period for public participation at every regular meeting as follows:

- A. Public participation shall be permitted as indicated on the order of business.
- B. Anyone attending the meeting may participate during the public portion of a meeting.
- C. Speakers shall be recognized by the presiding officer and will be requested to preface their comments by an announcement of their name, address, and group affiliation, if appropriate.
- D. Each statement made by a Speaker shall be limited to three (3) minutes duration, unless extended by Council.
- E. Participants shall present their comments as a speech or monologue; participants are not to address or pose questions to any Council members, employees or officials individually.
- F. The presiding officer may:
 - i. Interrupt or terminate a participant's statement when the statement goes in excess of three (3) minutes and is not extended by the Council;
 - ii. Request any individual to leave the meeting when that person's conduct causes a disruption to the Council completing and conducting business;
 - iii. Request the assistance of law enforcement officers in the removal of a person who causes a disruption to the Council completing and conducting business;
 - iv. Request a motion for recess or an adjournment to another time when a disruption prevents the Council from completing and conducting its business.

Section 2.

The Village of Blanchester finds and determines that all formal actions of this Village concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of the Village of Blanchester and that all deliberations of this Village of Blanchester that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 3.

The resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, or welfare of the residents of the Village of Blanchester.

Section 4.

That the Village by at least a three/fourths vote hereby dispenses with the requirement that this Resolution be read on three separate days and hereby authorizes the adoption of the Resolution upon its first reading. That this Resolution shall be effective at the earliest date allowed by law.

Section 5.


This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and immediately upon its adoption.

Section 731.19 | Subject and amendment of bylaws, ordinances, and resolutions.

Ohio Revised Code / Title 7 Municipal Corporations / Chapter 731 Organization

Effective: October 1, 1953 Latest Legislation: House Bill 1 - 100th General Assembly

No ordinance, resolution, or bylaw shall contain more than one subject, which shall be clearly expressed in its title. No bylaw or ordinance, or section thereof, shall be revived or amended, unless the new bylaw or ordinance contains the entire bylaw, ordinance, or section revived or amended, and the bylaw, ordinance, or section so amended shall be repealed. Each such bylaw, resolution, and ordinance shall be adopted or passed by a separate vote of the legislative authority of a municipal corporation and the yeas and nays shall be entered upon the journal.

The Blanchester Village Council welcomes public comments at their meetings and sets aside time in the agenda for public comment. All meetings of the Council are open to the public, subject to Executive Session Privilege. In order to permit the fair and orderly expression of such comment, the Council shall provide a period for public participation at every regular meeting as follows:

- A. Public participation shall be permitted as indicated on the order of business.
- B. Anyone having a legitimate interest in the actions of the Council may participate during the public portion of a meeting.
- C. Speakers shall be recognized by the presiding officer and will be requested to preface their comments by an announcement of their name, address, and group affiliation, if and when appropriate, and specific topic of comment (General topics, such as "Village operations", etc. are not sufficiently specific).
- D. Each statement made by a Speaker shall be limited one topic of discussion and for three (3) minutes duration, unless extended by motion of the Council.
- E. No participant may speak more than once on the same topic, whether at the same or multiple meetings.
- F. Participants shall present their comments as a speech or monologue; participants are not to address or question Council members, employees or officials individually.
- G. Participants shall not make complaints about Village officials or employees during public comment. Such concerns shall be directed to the individual department head and handled administratively.
- H. The presiding officer may:
 - a. Interrupt, warn, or terminate a participant's statement when the statement is too lengthy, personally directed, abusive, obscene, or irrelevant;
 - b. Request any individual to leave the meeting when that person does not observe reasonable decorum;
 - c. Request the assistance of law enforcement officers in the removal of a disorderly person;
 - d. Call for a recess or an adjournment to another time when the lack of public decorum so interferes with the orderly conduct of the meeting as to warrant such action.
- I. Council may prohibit future comment by any speaker who violates this policy.
